


How the Platypus Became

The Story Behind How the Platypus Became

The origins of *How the Platypus Became* stretch back more than two decades. At the age of ten, author Jonny Parry wrote and illustrated his first version of the story as part of a school project. That early draft was bound by hand and gifted to his younger sister.

Jonathan's fascination with the platypus had begun even earlier. His Australian aunt once brought him a Yowie chocolate, with a small toy inside - his was a platypus. From that moment, he was hooked. Long before the internet was at his fingertips, Jonny relied on library books, second-hand knowledge, and his imagination to fill in the gaps about this extraordinary animal.

The childhood 'manuscript' sat in a box for years until Jonny's father rediscovered it and encouraged him to revisit the idea. While rereading it on a family holiday, Jonny realised there

was a story worth re-telling - one that could grow into a fully realised picture book for today's readers.

Reworked and refined, and brought vividly to life through the illustrations of Ffion Evans, *How the Platypus Became* is both a debut publication and the fulfilment of a childhood dream: a story first imagined in felt-tip pens, now ready to inspire new generations of curious readers.
